The "ICJ4ICJ" or Inter-generational Climate Justice for the International Court of Justice is a moot court workshop that will address the responsibility of nation-states, under international law, to address the global climate crisis for the benefit of present and future generations.

During the 1 September 2016 Pre-Workshop event held at the Hawai'i Supreme Court, Chief Justice Mark Recktenwald of the Hawai'i Supreme Court (USA) and international environmental law jurists presided over a mock hearing before the International Court of Justice, with top law students from around the world representing regional intergovernmental organizations on the issue.

At the Workshop on 5 September 2016, attendees will have an opportunity to view filmed segments of the mock hearing, as well as engage in the dialogue between the judges, students, and commentators on this pressing environmental issue. https://portals.iucn.org/congress/session/9695
